Our week at school began with a very moving service for Remembrance allowing the school community to reflect on the generations who have given their lives for modern peace and freedom. Mr Howorth and the captains of school shared stories of soldiers and families' experiences of World War 1 and our service explored the contributions of black and Asian soldiers, including Sepoy Khudadad Khan, who as one of 1.2 million Indian soldiers became the first Muslim recipient of the Victoria Cross, Britain's highest award for bravery, 110 years ago in 1914. Our service featured a ceremonial presentation of a wreath and beautiful poppy-inspired artwork from the children in Year 2.

Tuesday was a riot of colour with the children and staff embracing 'Odd Socks Day' to highlight Antibullying Week and give a strong message that it is OK to be different! The odd socks were also in evidence at the Teatime Concert after school, which saw a wide range of fantastic instrumental and voice performances, reflecting the very large numbers of children who are learning music outside of class lessons. Reception children have had great fun learning nursery rhymes this term, including a lovely project all about Humpty Dumpty, and this week saw a great rendition out in our outdoor learning area! At the top end of the school, the senior boys took a fantastic trip to the Yvonne Arnaud Theatre in Guildford to see a rather amusing, unique and audacious retelling of Jane Austen's most iconic love story, Pride and Prejudice, thanks to Mrs Kidson and Ms May.

Finally, I must mention the pleasure we had in welcoming so many of our new Reception 2025 starters on Wednesday to see the teachers and make some new friends as part of our transition programme. It was wonderful to see the children already so happy at TPS and I gather one or two are wishing they could start now! Thank you to all the staff for making the children feel so welcome and part of the TPS family.

New Clarinet Ensemble with Mrs Hill

IMPORTANT INFORMATION - Diarrhoea and Vomiting

Diarrhoea and Vomiting illnesses commonly affect children and staff and can be caused by a number of different germs, including viruses, parasites and bacteria. Infections can be easily spread from person to person (by unwashed hands), especially in children. It is recommended by the NHS that any child with diarrhoea and/or vomiting symptoms must stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours). If your child is sick at school, we will ask a parent/carer to come and collect their child and take them home.

They should not return for 48 hours after the last episode. We appreciate that this is inconvenient in many cases, but you will appreciate that we do this as it reduces the risk of infection for all children in school. As an example, if your child is sick at lunchtime on a Tuesday, they should not return to school until after lunch on Thursday, provided there have not been any further episodes of vomiting or diarrhoea.
