The penultimate week of the school year at TPS is our 'Trips Week' and the heavens smiled on the year groups that have travelled near and far seeking adventure. Our most ambitious trip has seen the Year 6 children travel to Maison Claire Fontaine in Burgundy, leaving last Sunday for a week of language immersion, led by Mrs Gliniecka, whilst the senior boys reached the beautiful coastline in Pembrokeshire, close to St David's, for a water sports extravaganza, courtesy of Mr Howorth. Year 4, led by Mrs Harber, have visited the PGL centre at Marchants Hill for two nights, taking on physical and teamwork challenges in the dappled, leafy woodland setting. Yesterday, I left early to visit Mrs Hepburn and Year 5 at Osmington Bay, which must be one of the most picturesque and inspiring settings for an adventure camp imaginable, with far reaching views out to Portland and beyond. I can report back that, without exception, the children have had the most wonderful week, and took great pleasure in sharing their highlights and food reviews. On close inspection, I can also vouch for the quality of the zip wire! It's fascinating to see the children pushing their boundaries in a very different setting and learn so much about themselves in the process. My sincere thanks go to all the TPS staff who have helped make Trips Week such a resounding success.

Back at TPS, the Pre-Prep children and Year 3 enjoyed a super Image Theatre production of the 'The Selfish Giant' on Wednesday, and Mrs Barnes' assembly focused on the Republic of Ireland, continuing her series of assemblies on countries with which our children have personal or family connections. On Thursday, I was delighted to host a special talk delivered by Ms Jen Farmer from Sir William Perkins's, E-Safety expert, who explored some fascinating insights on the journey for children as they become independent users of technology, with key messages about the importance of pre-planning before phones are given to children, keeping the use of technology in the common areas of the household and realising that children will make mistakes along the way. This was one of the best talks I have witnessed on this complex topic, thanks to Ms Farmer's insight and expertise.
